Our Heritage:

The first meeting to consider the formation of a state Home Demonstration Council was called by Family Living Programs State Leader, Blanche L. Lee, in 1939. The meeting occurred during at the Cooperative Extension sponsored Farm Home Week, in Madison.

The first official meeting of presidents of county Home Demonstration Councils was held January 30, 1940. Twenty-two counties were represented. The purpose of the council was to:

- Provide representation of rural women on state committees concerned with issues which affect home and families in rural communities.
- Develop an awareness of national and international interests and needs.
- Develop leadership abilities of rural women.
- Facilitate statewide acquaintances of rural women.

Today:

Little has changed since that time. Our current goals are to:

- Provide continuing education for members and others on issues that will strengthen families and communities.
- Develop and improve leadership skills of members.
- Build coalitions with other organizations and agencies having similar objectives and concerns as WAHCE, Inc.
- Promote friendships and understanding with all people of the world.
