Camp Fees and Transportation

Camp Fee : \$135 for Kewaunee County 4-H members and \$155 for community members not enrolled in 4-H. Camp fees cover lodging, meals, snacks, crafts, camp T-shirt, transportation, other activities, and insurance.

Refund Policy: A complete refund, except \$20, will be made to you if you cancel more than fourteen days prior to the first day of camp. No refund is given after this time except for prorated refunds in case of major illness, accident, or death in the family.

Bus Transportation: Buses leave the Luxemburg area the morning of June 14th and return in the afternoon on June 17th. Further details about arrival and departure times will be provided prior to camp. 4-H Summer Camp is for any youth 3rd-6th grade, as of the 2016-2017 school year. Youth do not need to be a 4-H member to participate.

4-H Camp is about providing youth a chance to make new friends and belong to a group, explore new skills and interests, and build responsibility and independence. At Summer Camp, you will enjoy a variety of camp activities including swimming, arts and crafts, and nature. There are activities at night including campfires and games.

Camp Information

Camp Bird consists of five cabins in each of its four units. Typically 8-9 youth and one or two youth counselors live in each cabin. Adult 4-H volunteers stay in a cabin nearby. A bath house with individual bathroom and shower facilities is conveniently located near each cabin unit.

A large dining hall with a modern kitchen is at the center of the grounds. All campers are served plentiful, nutritious, family style meals. A large recreation hall, craft shop, and nature building are available for inclement weather.

Parents should keep in mind that all activities in life pose some risk. Please be aware that camp is located in a wooded Wisconsin Northwood's area with a lake. Therefore, wood ticks, deer ticks, other insects, and wild animals are at camp and in the surrounding area. Primary insurance coverage is always the responsibility of the parent.

Camp Staff

The camp is overseen by the county 4-H Youth Development Educators. The camp staff consists of full-time adult paid staff plus adult volunteers who serve as chaperones, role models, and activity directors each session of camp. All of the adult volunteers have completed the 4-H youth protection process.

A health coordinator, who is trained in first aid and CPR, is on duty to handle health and safety needs. The coordinator can only administer medications sent with the camper and as directed on the Youth Event Health form. The local Rescue Squad is ready to handle any emergencies. Campers are covered by accident insurance.

Campers will be spending the majority of their time under the direct supervision of youth volunteer staff (counselors, junior counselors, and assistant program leaders). All youth staff, range in age from 14-19.

Camp Activities

Waterfront: You will be able to refresh yourself by swimming, boating, and canoeing in lovely Sand Lake. There is a required swim test given at camp before campers can go into deep water. A lifeguard is present during all waterfront activities.

Nature: You will have opportunities to explore the many natural wonders in and around camp such as the lake, nature trails, streams, animal tracks, birds, and trees. Nature may include hiking on uneven terrain or opportunities to go on a night hike with adult supervision.

Recreation: You will have opportunities to get involved with other campers in large group games and sports, which may include running and personal contact with other participants.

Arts and Crafts: As a camper, you will explore your creative abilities to make things and express yourself.

Campfires: As a camper, you will be able to celebrate with music, skits, storytelling, and entertainment.

Activities: All areas of camp will offer a variety of activities including skits, group activities, talent shows, eco-exploring and possibly archery. In some group activities, it may be necessary of a volunteer to position a child for proper stance or effectiveness, but only with the child's permission.
