Quan served over 20 years in prison. He is now the founder and CEO of Jade Janitors. Quan has hired several people with criminal histories and generated an average of \$77,778 in yearly revenue. The initial startup cost for Jade Janitors in 2016 was only \$1,800. Since that time, Jade Janitors has grossed \$350,000.

The Bootcamp is open to formerly incarcerated people who have been released for over six months, have housing and basic income, have access to a computer and WiFi, and have the drive to launch a new business. As part of the Entrepreneurship Bootcamp, you will need to commit to a minimum of six hours per week for class time and independent work.
