## Warm Up With a Bowl of Soup!

### Turkey Roast and Rice Soup

This Turkey Roast and Rice Soup is the perfect way to use leftover turkey. Have leftover chicken? Use that instead! Add any frozen vegetables or fresh greens to switch up the flavors!

Makes: 8 Servings

### Ingredients

- 5 oz thawed turkey roast, chopped (about 1 cup)
- 4 celery stalks, chopped
- 4 carrots, peeled and sliced
- 1 onion, chopped 1 chicken bouillon cube, low sodium
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 4 cups water
- 1 Tbs margarine
- 1 cup uncooked brown rice
- 1 can (15oz) green beans, low sodium, drained

### Instructions

In a large pot over high heat, add the turkey roast, celery, carrots, onion, bouillon cube, black pepper, and 4 cups of water. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat, and cook over low heat for 30 minutes. Cook rice according to package directions. Add cooked rice and green beans into the soup and stir. Cook for 5 more minutes.

# What can Wisconsin farmers do about projected low profit margins?

The USDA's 2025 projections for corn and soybean prices are **below the estimated break-even prices** for Wisconsin farmers. The USDA projects a season-average farm price of **\$3.90 per bushel for corn** and **\$10.00 per bushel for soybeans**. However, the estimated break-even prices for Wisconsin are **\$4.65 per bushel for corn** and **\$10.80 per bushel for soybeans**. If these projections hold true, Wisconsin grain farmers are likely to face **negative margins** in 2025.

#### What can Wisconsin farmers do?

- Review and renegotiate a farmland lease or rental contract details
- Strategically manage borrowing costs
- Consider alternatives to high-cost investments

# Got plant problems? Learn plant diagnostics online

*Plant Diagnostics: The Step-by-Step Approach to Identifying Plant Problems* is an online course offered by the UW-Madison Division of Extension Horticulture Program. The course, which runs Feb. 1-April 30, 2025, is designed to teach you troubleshooting skills for plant-related problems.

Learn the step-by-step process for identifying plant problems in your yard and garden, and even in houseplants. - Identify appropriate resources to use for diagnostics
- Know how to access UW-Madison Extension diagnostic labs and services for additional support



Plant Diagnostics: The Step-by-Step Approach to Identifying Plant Problems is self-paced with 13 modules that include videos, readings, and interactive activities. Course participants are also invited to attend two live webinars, "Putting the Process into Practice: Real World Diagnostics", led by Extension educators, and "Meet the Labs!", presented by UW-Madison diagnostic lab directors.
